#### Get your home winter-ready today!



There is still time to register for the government-backed scheme targeted at inefficient homes not heated by gas. If you are concerned about the cost of energy bills and looking for ways to make your home cheaper to heat and more comfortable to live in, you may be able to apply for a **grant from Oxfordshire County Council to improve your home**. With the Home Upgrade Grant (HUG2), eligible homes can receive tailored energy solutions, from insulation to solar

panels, resulting in a warmer home, lower bills and reduced carbon emissions - all delivered by the Welcome the Warmth team. Check your eligibility and apply through the website at <u>welcomethewarmth.org.uk</u>

### FREE Comet/HandyBus Service

A few details about the services, starting this month:

- Free shopping trip service twice a month to Henley with pick up and return from passenger's doorsteps.
- Address details, phone number and postcode will need to be supplied at the time of booking.
- The service is aimed at people that are unable to drive for one reason or another (don't drive, don't own a car or have a medical condition which means they cannot drive).
- A current bus pass is required to travel.

#### Wondering what to do with your Christmas tree? HMP Huntercombe have a suggestion for you:



If you have a 'real' Christmas tree and would like to recycle it to help the bees, please consider donating it to **South Chilterns Beekeeping Association**. We would welcome your tree so that we can continue to build up the dead-hedge that was built the year before last around the NE boundary of theTeaching Apiary to help to keep the cold/fast winds from chilling/knocking over the hives, while at the same time providing shelter/hibernation/nesting sites for small mammals, birds, amphibians and insects

throughout the year. The dead hedge has worked extremely well, but gradually sinks down as the bottom decomposes and therefore needs topping up every year, so we look forward to receiving your Christmas tree contributions.

If you could bring your Christmas trees (and any tree branch prunings, etc from your garden you would like to dispose of) to the Teaching Apiary which is sited in the outer grounds of **Huntercombe Prison**, **Nuffield**, **Oxon**, **RG9 5SB between 11am and 1.00pm this coming Sunday**, **7th January**. SCBA Committee Members will be onsite to take your trees and add these to the hedge. Directions: enter the Prison site via Bradley Road, with the visitors car park on your right and the single storey buildings on your left, just past these low buildings - immediately turn left onto the service road. Drive through the large metal gates in front of you (as although security is normally very tight, these gates will be open for the tree drop-off at that time). Follow that service road until you see two/three skips coming up on your right - turn right in front of these skips, follow the track and the Apiary is on your left.

We would be grateful if you could spread the word about this tree drop-off with friends, family, neighbours and on your facebook page as the dead-hedge beds down quite quickly over the course of the year, so the more plant material the better!
